Great, so how do I sign up?

At YRIS, we have two categories of writers: staff writers and non-staff writers. Staff writers are Yale undergraduates who attend YRIS staff meetings and write on a semesterly basis. To apply to YRIS, either fill out the staff writer application at the beginning of the semester or contact yris@yira.org for rolling admission to the journal. Non-staff writers are Yale students/non-Yale students who submit pieces on a rolling basis. The writing publication process looks different for each so <a href="mailto:mai

How do I submit an article if I'm a Staff Writer?

- 1. Email your article to your respective desk head.
- 2. If approved, your desk head will send the piece to the managing editor to begin the editing process.
- 3. Once assigned to an assistant editor, you will go through 2-5 rounds of edits.
 - a. Please notify everyone in this email chain any time new edits have been made/accepted.
 - b. Please CC managing@yris.yira.org in all your correspondence.
 - c. All edits and comments should be made on the same Google doc.
- 4. Once all rounds of edits have been made, the piece will be sent back to the managing editor for a final read-through and publication.

How do I submit an article if I'm not a Staff Writer?

If you are not a staff writer, please submit via the Online Submissions Form on our website.

General Formatting Guidelines

- All articles should be approximately ~2,000 words.
- We are looking for **opinion pieces** that showcase your unique perspective on an issue.
- We are <u>not</u> looking for:
 - News Reports: We are not CNN. We don't have on-the-field reporters producing original news. As such, we avoid summary and exegesis.
 - Essays, Papers & Policy Reports: While the "thesis, 3 paragraph, conclusion" format might work well in a college school essay, it is not required nor recommended for our purposes. Also, try to avoid highly technical language, diagrams, and formulas.
- If you are citing an academic publication, use Chicago-style footnotes.
- If you are citing anything else, hyperlink the website in the text.
 - This article is a good example of how to hyperlink
